BOYS AND GIRLS LACROSSE GUIDELINES

1. SEASON

- 1.1 Practice may begin the first Monday in February.
- 1.2 A league schedule will be presented to the Board of Governors for approval each year.
- 1.3 Number of Contests:
 - 1.3.1 20 contests for both Varsity and JV
 - 1.3.2 2 scrimmages
- 1.4 Scrimmages Defined
 - 1.4.1 There will be no paid officials, no publicity, no score kept.
 - 1.4.2 Scrimmages will be indicated on the schedule as such.
 - 1.4.3 There will be unlimited time periods, free substitutions.
 - 1.4.4 Play may be stopped or interrupted by coaches.
 - 1.4.5 No admission will be charged.
- 1.5 Tournaments:
 - 1.5.1 Each game of a tournament counts as a complete game and will be counted in the maximum number of contests.
 - 1.5.2 All tournaments must be CIF sanctioned.

2. CONTEST INFORMATION

- 2.1 Starting Times: Boys, Junior Varsity 5:30; Varsity 7:30; Girls, JV 5:30, Varsity 7:00
- 2.2 Days of Competition: Tuesday and Thursday
- 2.3 Contest Format: Boys and Girls teams play at opposite sites on same day.
- 2.4 Spectator Control:
 - 2.4.1 Only players, coaches, trainers, doctors, game officials, scorekeepers and members of the press are allowed along the sidelines.
 - 2.4.2 Spectators must remain in the stands.
 - 2.4.3 Only ball retrievers are allowed behind the end line of the field. They must be equipped with the proper lacrosse protective equipment, including helmet, mouth guard, and other protective gear required of the players. The ball retrievers shall remain at least 15 yards behind the end line during play. Their attire should be in contrast to the two teams playing on the field.

3. PREVAILING RULES

- 3.1 All games will be conducted under the Federation of State High School Association's lacrosse rulebook, as mandated by the National Federation of State High School Athletic Association.
- 3.2 Games ending in a tie will go to sudden death overtime.
- 3.3 The home team will provide space at the scoring table for the visiting team score keeper. The home team will keep score and provide a copy of the score sheet to the visiting team in a timely manner.
- 3.4 The NCS Ejection Policy will be strictly enforced.

4. EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORMS

- 4.1 Uniforms: The home team will wear the light uniform and the visiting team will wear the dark uniform.

5. OFFICIALS

- 5.1 Varsity games will be played with two officials: one referee and one umpire. If a third official is provided by the officials association he/she will be a Field Judge.
 - 5.1.1 The referee's decision shall be deemed as official and is not subject to protest unless it can be proven that there was a definite misinterpretation of the rules.
 - 5.1.2 The officials association under contract to the league shall be used exclusively for all games.

6. DETERMINATION OF LEAGUE CHAMPIONS

- 6.1 League Champion
 - 6.1.1 The regular league season is defined as a Double Round Robin.
 - 6.1.2 The league champion will be the winner of the regular league season Double Round Robin. If there is a tie, the tied teams will be designated co-champions.
 - 6.1.3 Ties for NCS competition will be resolved using the tie-Breaking criteria. (See#7)

7. TIE BREAKER

- 7.1 Criteria for tie breaking between 2 teams qualifying for NCS playoff positions:
 - 7.1.1 Head to head competition.
 - 7.1.2 Team that won the second round game.

8. NCS QUALIFYING

- 8.1 The automatic representative to the NCS will be the league champion.

9. ALL LEAGUE SELECTION

- 9.1 **Boys:** Coaches shall select First Team and Honorable Mention All League teams.
 - 9.1.1 First team all league will be comprised of at least ten players. There will be three defense, three middies, three attack, and one goalie.
 - 9.1.2 Honorable Mention team will be comprised of players who have received votes from the coaches.
- Girls:**
 - 9.1.3 First team all league will be comprised of at least twelve players. There will be three defense, 5 middies, 3 attack and one goalie
 - 9.1.4 Honorable Mention team will be comprised of players who have received votes from the coaches
- 9.2 Nominating Procedure
 - 9.2.1 **Boys:** Each team may nominate up to five players. Names will be submitted by position: Defense, Middies, Attack and Goalie
 - 9.2.1.1 After names have been submitted, coaches will vote by position assigning 3 points for a first team player and one point for an honorable mention player. By position, the players that receive the most points will be designated first team; all other players that received points from the coaches will be designated honorable mention
 - 9.2.2 **Girls:** Each team may nominate up to six players. Names will be submitted by position: Defense, Middies, Attack and Goalie.
 - 9.2.2.1 The voting procedure for girls will be the same as for boys above.
- 9.3 Nominations for Most Valuable Player
 - 9.3.1 Coaches may nominate a Most Valuable Player.
 - 9.3.2 The MVP will be a separate selection from the first team all-league
